
## Does Ouster of Head of State or Govt affect International Agreements: A Comparative Study of Sri Lanka and Pakistan

#### Introduction

- The China Belt and Road initiatives in Sri Lanka
- First, Nov. 2013, China offered development of a new mega project at Sri Lanka's main port in Colombo.
- Various plans for a Colombo Port City Project (CPCP)
- Construction of Hambantota port, worth US\$
   1.1billion





### Introduction to Hambantota Port

- Hambantota, situated on the southern coast of the island.
- Historically, it was an important port for eastern Asian sailors and traders heading to Africa or the Middle East.
- CHEC has long been involved in the construction of Hambantota port, which launched in January 2008 (1st phase).
- The port, formally named the Magampura Mahinda Rajapaksa Port in 2010 (2<sup>nd</sup> phase).

## 3<sup>rd</sup> Phase (the current)

 Agreement signed on 30th July, 2017 between Sri Lanka and China Merchants Port Holdings

• US\$1.1 billion sale of a 70 percent stake in Hambantota port.

• 15,000 acre land for 99 years lease

## Why the agreement suspended

- The agreement was suspended by the new government on allegations of corruption on previous one.
- Involvement of China in support of Rajapakse in election campaign.
- Regional players interests;
  - Rajapakse inclination towards China
  - Siresina Inclination towards India
  - India fears of China may use this port for military purposes

#### Cont...

- Internal Politics
  - Only SLFP (Rajapakse group) and Marxist party are opposing this agreement
  - TNA (Tamil National Alliance), is not opposing because
    - First, its concern is Tamils political representation and not economy
    - Second, they are part of the government
  - Muslims also part of the government
  - They feel no direct impact on Muslims as a whole

# Why the new government become ready

- One view;
  - China's successful diplomacy
  - Ensured that these were not agreements with a person but with Lankan government
- Second view;
  - China indebted Lanka
  - New government had no other option but to sign the agreement
- Third (Geo-strategic)
  - Clearly mentioned in agreement that it is not a military but purely economic
  - The strategic relations will be continue with US and India

## Change-in-Leadership in Pakistan

• The delay in China-Lanka agreement because of some political and Geo-strategic issues

- The case in Pakistan is different;
  - No foreign actor is involved
  - Internal politics is not criticizing the agreement but other issues
  - The regime is not changed but only leader

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
