CEPEC Cooperation agreements with South Central

Few of Agreements with Pakistan

1. Rice Exporters Association of Pakistan (REAP) and Guangdong Provincial Grain Association of China signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU)
2. Pakistan and China have reached an agreement on building an oil refinery in Dera Ismail Khan , WAK group from Pakistan and Guangdong Electrical Design Institute from China.
3. Sindh Madressatul Islam University (SMIU) and South China University of Technology, Guangzhou agreements to provide strategic support to Gwadar Sea port
4. Development of industrial park and declaring Gwadar and Henan as sister cities.
5. Pakistan's Ambassador to China Masood Khalid has underscored for more cooperation between Pakistan and China's Hubei province in the fisheries and rice sectors.
6. The Agreement on Trade in Services was signed in Wuhan
7. The International Centre for Chemical and Biological Sciences (ICCBS) at Karachi University (KU) has recently signed an agreement with between Hunan Anbang Pharmaceutical Company (HAPC) .
8. The University of Veterinary and Animal Sciences (UVAS) and the Guangxi Buffalo Research Institute (GXBRI) signed an agreement to establish a "Sino-Pakistan Joint Buffalo Research Centre"
9. The Allama Iqbal Open University (AIU) and Guangxi Institute of Administration on signed an agreement to provide academic support to China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC).

Out of 35, 7 cities are from South Central

1. Wuhan is the capital of Hubei province, People's Republic of China(324 b equal to Israel)
2. Foshan, Guangdong Province in southeastern China (235 equal to Uzbekistan)
3. Dongguan, an industrial city in China's Pearl River Delta and city of Guangdong(186 b, Ethiopia)
4. Changsha, the capital of central China's Hunan province(246 b , Sri Lanka)
5. Tangshan is a city of Hebei province(191b New Zealand)
6. Zhengzhou, city of Henan province(210 b Ecuador)
7. Guangzhou , 524 b Switzerland

One of the three Mega Regions

- ▶ **Beijing-Tianjin**
With a combined GDP of \$1.14 trillion
- ▶ **Yangtze River Delta**
With a combined GDP of \$2.17 trillion
- ▶ **Pearl River Delta**
With a combined GDP of \$1.89 trillion, the Pearl River Delta has cities like Hong Kong, Guangzhou, Shenzhen, Foshan, Dongguan, and Macao.

1) Xi Jinping visit to Guangdong



▶ Reform, Protests

- ▶ Deng Xiaoping's landmark tour of Guangdong in 1978, 1992 (showing China's determination to continue reforms) The tactic worked. In 1992, China's income per capita was \$366, in 2017, 25 years later, it was 24 times greater.

▶ Trade War

- ▶ In the last 40 years, China's development achievements have impressed the world," the Chinese leader said.
- ▶ "I come to Shenzhen again ... so that we can declare to the world: China's reform and opening up will never stop,"
- ▶ The road of "reform and opening up" was the "correct path" and China could create "bigger miracles" by sticking to it.

Main purpose was

1. Boosting the masses
2. Reassuring private businesses
3. Encouraging integration of Hong Kong

2) Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Greater Bay Area

- ▶ The 55-km bridge, situated in the waters of Pearl River Estuary, connects the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (SAR), Zhuhai and the Macao SAR
- ▶ The bridge is the first of its kind for Guangdong, Hong Kong, and Macao to jointly build a supergiant sea-crossing traffic project under the principle of "one country, two systems."

3) The 2018 Guangdong 21st Century Maritime Silk Road (MSR) expo

- ▶ The 2018 Guangdong 21st Century Maritime Silk Road (MSR) International Expo kicked off in Dongguan on October 25th. The expo is hosted
- ▶ 1,732 exhibitors
- ▶ 1,221 overseas enterprises
- ▶ 57 countries and regions.
- ▶ The MSR Expo was first held in 2014 , it has become a significant platform for exchange & cooperation between Guangdong and countries and regions along the Belt and Road
