

- Chinese President Xi Jinping announced the opening of the world's first import-themed national-level expo in Shanghai on Monday 5 November .
- A total of 172 countries, regions and international organizations from five continents will showcase their development achievements and international image at the first China International Import Expo (CIIE).
- More than 3,600 companies from different countries will hold discussions and seek common development with over 400,000 purchasers from China and overseas.

- The CIIE has received companies from all the G20 member states, as well as more than 1,000 firms from over 50 countries and regions along the Belt and Road.
- And 35 of the 44 least developed countries in the world are attending the event.

- as well as about 180 U.S. companies.
- In the meantime, more than 170 African exhibitors have brought nearly 400 competitive products.

MAIN FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS

- Chinese private security companies (PSCs) are going global, encouraged by the saturation of the domestic market, the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) and Beijing's preference for using homegrown companies to protect its interests abroad.
- Projects related to the BRI have become a prime market for Chinese private security companies, as Chinese investment expands into countries that are either experiencing or emerging from conflict.
- Chinese private security companies operate overseas in a legal grey zone: Chinese domestic law does not apply to their international activities, and international law lacks regulation, so they only have to abide by local host country laws, where those exist.
- The behavior and operations of Chinese PSCs abroad vary widely from country to country, depending on their contracts and local legislation, or lack thereof.
- Beijing's use of private security companies to protect its overseas interests is risky. Due to their relative inexperience, there is high potential for mistakes that could create political backlash for Beijing.
- European Union member states' interests will be affected by Chinese PSCs' international expansion. The companies might contribute to an increase of instability in regions that are strategically important for Europe. At the same time, they could help Beijing increase its influence over host country governments.
- More thorough regulation of Chinese private security companies' international activities is urgently needed. Through their own national experience in regulating PSCs, European policymakers are in a unique position to help and encourage Beijing to pass relevant laws and at the same time assist host countries of Chinese PSC activity to strengthen their national legislation regulating foreign private security company activities.



HOSTAGE RESCUE

PSC involved: unknown
Customer: unknown Chinese construction firm
Incident: A dozen armed Chinese security contractors helped the Sudanese Army to rescue 29 kidnapped Chinese workers.

SHOOTING AND EVACUATION

Location: Juba, South Sudan
Date: 8 July 2016
PSC involved: DeWe Security (北京德威保安服务有限公司)
Customer: China National Petroleum Corporation (CNPC)
Incident: Executed evacuation plan for 300+ CNPC workers and civilians caught in shooting standoff between local warring factions.


The report estimates there will

- It predicted the top 10 fastest growing destinations for leisure travel spending between 2016 and 2026 would be India, Angola, Uganda, Brunei, Thailand, China, Myanmar, Oman and Vietnam.
- Within Asia, China is seeing the biggest tourism growth, with outbound trips set to reach 260 million by 2030. As well as becoming the biggest inbound market by 2030, domestic tourism is also taking off. And there will be 6.7 billion domestic trips by 2023, up from 4.7 billion in 2018.





- “Tourism is a key pillar of the Chinese economy, and much investment has been made to improve infrastructure and standards, in addition to tourism-friendly policies and initiatives.”

Singapore is China's Top Belt and Road Partner

- Singapore is the **largest foreign investor** into China, and Singapore is China's **largest investment destination** in Asia.
- China's Ministry of Commerce released data showing that 2018 Singapore had already invested **\$4 billion** into China, representing around **5%** of total inward FDI.
- Singapore prides itself on its professional services sector; it hosts a number of the world's biggest financial, legal and consulting firms who use the city state as their Asia headquarters.
- That leaves Singapore well positioned to service Belt and Road projects; in particular offering services such as: **project valuation, deal structuring, financing, and commercial dispute resolution.**



- In April 2018, Singapore [signed an MoU](#) with China to cooperate on developing and financing projects in BRI third markets.
- China, Singapore upgrade FTA to include Belt and Road initiative for 1st time

- There are more than 160 education administrative departments and educational institutions in 18 countries along the "Belt and Road", and more than 190 undergraduate and vocational colleges and industry enterprises attended the event.




CIIE 2018: 10 things the world wants to sell to China at inaugural import fair
