

Dissatisfaction with government of Haniyeh in Gaza reaches a peak with the continuation of the fuel and electricity crises in the strip; Dissatisfaction with the government of Fayyad increases with the discussions over its proposed austerity plan. 46 percent of the overall West Bank & Gaza sample blames Israel the most for the ongoing fuel crisis in Gaza, followed by Hamas (27 percent). These are the result of a recent Palestinians survey. (AWRAD)





A Third of Voters Favor Death for Solider Accused of Murdering Afghan Civilians

61% Want Afghan Withdrawal as Soon As Safely Possible



UTICA, NY – Thirty-six percent of likely voters believe that the US Army sergeant accused of killing 16 Afghan civilians in their homes should receive a death sentence if convicted, a new IBOPE Zogby survey finds.

The interactive survey, conducted from March 16-19, finds 48% don't think a death sentence should be imposed,



and eight in ten do not think he should be turned over to the Afghan government for

prosecution.

Army sergeant Robert Bales, who is charged in the killings, is in pretrial isolation at Fort Leavenworth.

Partisan responses about whether he should be subject to the death penalty run somewhat counter to the usual attitudes of Democrats and Republicans toward capital punishment. While Democrats are more likely to generally oppose the death penalty, in this case 41% favor it compared to 32% of Republicans.

There is also strong sentiment for speeding up the withdrawal of US troops from Afghanistan, with 61% wanting them out as soon as safely possible. More people think, however, that a US presence in Afghanistan makes that country more stable than unstable (37% to 28%), with 30% thinking it makes no difference.

Voters were given three choices about withdrawal plans, with 61% wanting the soonest departure, 16% wanting to stay with the current plan of having troops gone by the end of 2014 and 16% saying they should stay "until the mission is accomplished." Having US troops out of Afghanistan as soon as is safely possible is the top choice across party lines, including 61% of Democrats, 50% of Republicans and 66% of independents.

IBOPE Zogby International conducted an online survey of 2,076 likely voters. The margin of error is +/-2.2 percentage points. A sampling of IBOPE Zogby International's online panel, which is representative of the adult population of the US, was invited to participate. Slight weights were added to region, party, age, race, religion, gender and education to more accurately reflect the population.

Americans Would Not Grant Pardons to Murderers and Armed Robbers

The idea of commuting a prison sentence, so that a convicted person does not have to spend time in jail, is rejected by a majority of respondents.



A sizeable proportion of Americans reject the notion of Presidents or Governors issuing pardons for people guilty of a wide array of offences, a new Angus Reid Public Opinion poll has found.

In the online survey of a representative national sample of 1,012 American adults, more than three quarters of respondents believe an executive pardon should not be issued for someone who has been convicted of rape (85%), murder (84%), drunk driving causing death (77%) or armed robbery (75%).

Two thirds of Americans (66%) believe people who committed fraud or embezzlement should not be pardoned by a President or Governor, and more than half (52%) would not issue a pardon to someone convicted of theft.

In January, Mississippi Governor Haley Barbour issued pardons and clemencies to more than 200 people. The decision proved controversial, as Barbour pardoned four convicted murderers as well as an armed robber who were serving life sentences and worked as inmate trusties at the Governor's Mansion.

Across the country, 49 per cent of respondents agree with the President and most Governors having the power to grant pardons at their discretion, while 43 per cent disagree. There is a discernible gender gap on this question. More than half of male respondents (53%) support the concept of executive pardons, but only 44 per cent of women concur.

Americans are divided on whether a President or Governor should be allowed to commute a death sentence into life in prison (47% believe this type of pardon is acceptable, while 45% disagree). However, almost two thirds are against issuing a pardon that commutes a prison sentence, so that a convicted person does not have to spend time in jail (64%) and a pardon that completely removes a criminal conviction from a person's record (65%).

The political breakdowns show that Democrats have a more lenient stance on pardons—particularly on the issue of commuting death sentences—while Republicans, and to a lesser extent Independents, keep a harder line.

Methodology: From March 20 to March 21, 2012, Angus Reid Public Opinion conducted an online survey among 1,012 American adults who are Springboard America panelists. The margin of error—which measures sampling variability—is +/- 3.1%. The results have been statistically weighted according to the most current education, age, gender and region Census data to ensure a sample representative of the entire adult population of the United States. Discrepancies in or between totals are due to rounding.


