(Philippines) Forty-two percent of adult Filipinos are now using the Internet, according to the First Quarter 2018 Social Weather Survey fielded on March 23-27, 2018. This is a point higher than the 41% in June 2017 [Chart 1, Table 1]. Among adult Filipino Internet users, 67% said the fake news problem in the Internet is serious (40% very serious and 26% somewhat serious, correctly rounded), 20% were undecided, and 13% said it is not serious (9% somewhat not serious and 4% not serious at all). (Africa) In commemoration of President Buhari's 3<sup>rd</sup> year in office, we release figures from our monthly approval rating for the 3-year period (June 2015 to May 2018). The results show that over the last three years the President's job performance rating has taken a downward plunge, plummeting from his highest rating of 78 percent and 80 percent recorded in September and October 2015, to 37 percent recorded in August 2016 and more recently 38 percent and 39 percent in the months of February and April 2018 respectively. The survey shows that those aged 45-54 are the most likely (59%) to say this, followed by 25-34 year-olds (58%), and those in the 35-44 age bracket (56%). However, the youngest (18-24, 50%) and oldest (55+, 49%) are the least likely to say they felt it had been a while since they had made a new friend.

(USA) A broad majority of Americans, 72%, continue to believe that doctors should be legally allowed, at a patient's and a family's request, to end a terminally ill patient's life using painless means. While support for legalized euthanasia is strong across nearly all subgroups of Americans, men, young adults, Democrats and liberals are especially likely to favor it. Support drops below a majority only among weekly churchgoers. (Gallup USA)



# Africans increasingly support multiparty democracy, but trust in political parties remains low



Public attitudes in Africa show increasing support for multiparty democracy, but both ruling and opposition parties still struggle to gain popular trust, Afrobarometer survey findings show.

A majority of Africans say they "feel close to" a political party and believe multiple parties are needed to give voters a genuine choice, but fewer than half trust parties even "somewhat." These findings, based on 2014/2015 surveys in 36 African countries, were shared by Afrobarometer Executive Director E. Gyimah-Boadi at the Consultative Workshop of the Department of Political Affairs of the African Union Commission's Political Party Program in Accra.


